Educational overview

This course has been developed through the collaborative efforts of the faculty and will review the newest products and latest trends with injectable products for facial aesthetic enhancement/rejuvenation. A review of the aging process, decade by decade and how this impacts the choice of product(s) and procedure(s) will be discussed. Audience interaction will be encouraged during a number of aesthetic analysis demonstrations.

Lecture and discussion will be complemented by live and video patient demonstrations, which will feature new and emerging techniques such as the use of blunt cannulas for product delivery to certain areas of the face.
